#### INTRODUCTION:

The Malton Food Lovers Festival is an event being held both indoors and outdoors with various food and drinks stands serving and selling products. No.18 will be sampling and selling products to the public. The following outlines potential risks/ dangers and our plans and actions for these potential risks/ dangers.

We also have a number in the far right column where 1 = low risk, 2 = medium risk, 3 = high risk . This ranking system allows risks to be reviewed quickly while the rest of the table allows more in depth analysis.
